Today's the day to be painfully honest with ourselves. Deep within we struggle with battles, temptations, and frustrations. We're not short on desire or sincerity, but when it comes to living as we should, *we blow it!* No other chapter in the Bible brings this ugly fact out of the closet, exposing it in all its reality, like this one in Paul's letter to the Romans. Stated succinctly, he declares, *"The trouble is with me, for I am . . . a slave to sin"* (7:14). He is even stronger later on, *"Wretched man that I am!"* (7:24 NASB). When Charles Haddon Spurgeon stood to preach on this awful reality, he chose this title, appropriately, *"The Monster Dragged to Light."* Today, let's face the wretched monster head-on.
