

CELEBRATE KING JESUS

This Advent resource is designed to help your whole family experience the true joy of Christmas—knowing Jesus Christ, our Savior.

You can use these cards alongside the Our King Has Come devotional guide or on their own. However you choose to use them, we pray these cards help your family think and talk about Jesus every day of December as you count down to Christmas.

HOW TO USE THESE CARDS

- 1. Place these cards in a gift box, bag, or any container you like.
- 2. Pull out one card each day of December leading up to Christmas, and read the Scripture verse referenced on the card. There are also two bonus cards with ideas for family activities!
- 3. Display the cards in your home to remind you of who Jesus is throughout the Christmas season. You could hang them up as ornaments, put them on a fridge or corkboard, etc.
- 4. Keep the cards and use them year after year!

FAMILY ACTIVITIES PART ONE

- ☐ Take a walk or drive to look at Christmas lights, and talk about Jesus, the Light of the world.
- ☐ Eat a meal together by candlelight, and invite everyone to share the best piece of good news they received all year.
- ☐ Dim the lights at home, and read the Christmas story (Luke 1-2:38) by the light of the Christmas tree.
- ☐ Make a Christmas card to give to a neighbor or a friend from school.
- ☐ Print out sheet music or lyrics for your favorite Christmas songs and make a family songbook.

PART TWO

- ☐ Step outside on a clear night and look up at the stars. Imagine what it was like for the wise men who followed a star to find Jesus.
- ☐ Leave a bag of Christmas treats on the doorstep for delivery workers. Make a festive sign to say thank you!
- ☐ Draw and color a crown, banner, or throne for King Jesus.
- ☐ Make up a prayer for peace that your kids can say any time they feel worried. Remind them that Jesus is the Prince of Peace!
- ☐ Share the joy of the season—shop for items to donate to a food drive or toy drive for families in need.
