SATURDAY, DECEMBER 3



In the beginning, God walked with man. He wanted a relationship with His creation—one of family and closeness, since He is the embodiment of love. And although we are separated by sin, He is ever-faithful and made a way for us to reconnect. His love is a promise.

"And I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow—not even the powers of hell can separate us from God's love. No power in the sky above or in the earth below—indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord."—Romans 8:38–39 (NIV)

We have so many words and actions to seal a promise. Even the smallest children mark the solemnity and sincerity of the occasion with the hooking of pinkies—unshakable playground

pacts that rulers of countries would envy. Our promises are special and meaningful, and those who keep them are considered trustworthy, honest, and honorable. How much more powerful are God's promises to us?

God wants a relationship with us.



LORY

God made His dwelling place among us. Jesus took His place on earth to grow, walk, learn, teach, and save. The heavens celebrated and heralded His coming, its anticipation joyously released in songs of adoration from an angelic host.

An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; He is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests."—Luke 2:9–14 (NIV)

This Gift, our Savior, lay wrapped in linen just as He would a little more than 30 years later when He laid in a grave. But He wouldn't be there long. 

HOSEN

Before it all, before we even drew breath, God loved us. Despite the shortcomings He knew we would have, the mistakes He knew we would make . . . the imperfections He knew would tarnish our entire being—He still loved us. 

YEAR-END THOUGHTS



CONCLUSION DO YOU KNOW HIM?
