WONDER TRUTH: Jesus Teaches Us to Love Everyone

Kindness. It's a buzzword. We see it on T-shirts.

Choose kindness!

Kindness matters!

Kind is the new cool!

It's easy to be kind when people are kind to us. It's not so easy when they drag our name through the mud or talk behind our back.

Jesus takes kindness to a new level.

Jesus says to love.

Love your enemies.

Pray for your enemies.

Really? Is that even possible? Read [Matthew 5:43–45a](#).

Can you imagine wearing a T-shirt that says, "Love Your Enemies," while screaming at the driver who cut you off on the road? Not a good look! I get it. It's a tough thing to do.

When we love our enemies, it doesn't mean the hurt doesn't exist, but we choose to love because God loves us. We choose to pray for our enemies instead of hating them because God loves us. We choose to show mercy instead of being cruel because God loves us. As followers of Jesus, we choose to be like Him and trust Him to be in charge and show us how to love others with His mercy and grace.

As you lead kids today, remember some of them have been hurt deeply by others.

- How can you invite kids to let God care for their hurt?
- How can you help kids understand what loving their enemies looks like?

DID YOU KNOW?

FOUNDATION BUILDING BLOCKS

WHO?

Jesus is the Son of God and the “exact representation” of the heavenly Father ([Hebrews 1:3, NIV](#)). He tells of the Father’s mercy and care for the world. God is unwavering in patience; God’s people can love enemies if they trust God to handle evil.

WHAT?

“You have heard that it was said ...” ([Matthew 5:43, NIV](#)) is Jesus’ way of introducing a quotation from the Law of Moses. He heightens rather than diminishes the demands of the Torah, giving authoritative commentary on the way God’s people must behave.

WHERE?

Jesus’ early ministry is set in the small villages of Galilee. Pharisees and Sadducees—influential and religious Jews—would be less likely to travel all the way down from Judea. But large crowds are nonetheless coming from all the surrounding regions ([Matthew 4:25](#)).

WHEN?

By this early point in Matthew’s narrative, Jesus already has enemies. Herod slaughtered babies to try to kill Him. And as an adult, Jesus carried on the legacy of John the Baptist, who was arrested and would soon be executed ([Matthew 14:3–12](#)).

CONNECTING TO GOD’S BIG STORY

Jesus had enemies, but His greatest enemies turned out to be the powers of sin and death (see [1 Corinthians 15:20–28](#)). To be like Jesus and like our Father in heaven, we must seek the welfare of people we perceive as enemies.



Curiosity

LESSON 3 **EARLY CHILDHOOD**

Spark curiosity, encourage exploration, and get kids thinking about the wonder of God.

Curiosity Activity: Heart Scavenger Hunt

SUPPLIES: construction paper hearts

Ahead of time, cut one paper heart per kid from multiple colors of paper. Scatter the hearts around the room. Greet the kids warmly and welcome them to church.

Welcome! I am so glad you are here today! I have put some hearts all around the room. Do you think you can help me find them?

Show kids an example of the hearts that you have scattered around the room. Guide kids to look and find the hearts. Encourage them to bring the hearts to the center of the circle after they have found them, have them come sit down with you.

Wow! You did a great job finding all these hearts. I love seeing all the colors. Name the colors of the hearts as you hold them up. **These hearts make me think of loving everyone!**

Guide kids into knowing God more deeply, exploring His big story, and marveling at His wonder.

Prayer of Invitation

Before entering into God's big story, lead kids in a prayer of invitation. Use the prayer here or your own words:
God, thank You for being with us today. Please help us listen closely as we learn more about loving everyone. Thank You for giving us the Holy Spirit to guide us in being more like You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

God's Big Story

Pull out the Bible.

Ask: What is this called? *The Bible*

Ask: Why is the Bible important? *Because it is God's word. Everything in it is true. It really happened.*

TELL THE BIBLE STORY

"The Sermon on the Mount"

Word of Wonder

WORD OF WONDER

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see the face of God."

—Matthew 5:8

Gather kids to discuss these questions:

- Who first said the words from our Word of Wonder?
- How can God help us have a pure heart?



Identity

Create space for God to remind kids they are known, loved, led, and their lives can tell of God's wonder.

Stamp a Heart

SUPPLIES: die cut hearts, ink pad with washable red and pink ink, wet wipes

We use heart shapes to remind us of love. Let's use our fingerprints to decorate some hearts to remind us that Jesus teaches us to love everyone.

Give each kid a heart shape. Place the kid's index finger on the ink pad. Guide the child to stamp his fingerprint inside the heart shape several times. Reapply ink from the ink pad if needed. Use wet wipes for cleaning.

Prayer and Blessing

After the kids finish their activity, pray with them, thanking God for His great love and His help He gives to us to love everyone.

God, thank You for our special time today to learn more about You. Thank You for loving us so much, no matter what. Please help us show love and kindness to everyone this week. Thank You for giving us Your Spirit to guide us in following You. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Encourage the kids to hold their hands out in front of them, with palms up, as if their hands were open to receive something. Tell them to listen and receive the blessing as you speak it over them.

Blessing: May you feel the love of God as you choose to love everyone this week.
