WONDER TRUTH: Jesus' Words Matter

SCRIPTURE: Mark 4

WORD OF WONDER: Luke 10:27

A few years ago, we had a vine of small squash growing in our church parking lot. I noticed it on a prayer walk one day: small yellow squash growing on a green vine that covered an entire "island" in the lot. We realized this plant had probably come to grow here because a child from our summer camp disposed of seeds from a project in the rocks of the parking lot island.

My mind immediately went to the familiar parable in Mark 4:1–20, where a farmer is scattering seed. Some seed falls on the path, where the birds eat it. Some seed falls on rocks and springs up, but because it is without roots the growth withers away. Some seed falls in thorns and is choked out. Finally, some seed falls on good soil, and it produces a crop that multiplies.

Each week, we hopefully and expectantly sow the Word in the lives of the children God entrusts to us. We pray they would be like the good soil, and that they would respond to God's Word in obedience because they know they are known, led, and loved. So we stay faithful to sowing the seed, hopeful that they will obey it and one day we will see the fruit that grows in their lives and spills into the lives of others.

LESSON 2 FOR LEADERS SEEDS AND SOIL

DID YOU KNOW?

FOUNDATION BUILDING BLOCKS

WHO?

Mark is the shortest, simplest, and probably the earliest of the Gospels. According to the church father Papias, Mark is based upon Peter's oral preaching. But Mark is also hardest on Jesus' disciples, showing that they continued to misunderstand Jesus during His ministry.

WHAT?

Not everyone is receptive to Jesus' message, for He is like the prophet Isaiah, who was also disbelieved and rejected (Mark 4:12 quotes Isaiah 6:9–10). But the good soil is exceptionally fertile with its tremendous—almost unbelievable—harvest (Mark 4:8).

WHERE?

By speaking from the lake, Jesus' voice carried across the water so that a large crowd could hear Him. In Mark 4, Jesus is still preaching in rural Galilee, but He will soon travel to Jerusalem to confront the religious and civic authorities.

WHEN?

This parable comes early in the Gospel of Mark and provides a lens for the narrative as a whole. Only the disciples are given the parable's interpretation, and they too will be challenged to endure persecution and trouble when Jesus is arrested.

CONNECTING TO GOD'S BIG STORY

Like Moses, Jesus calls people to listen to and obey God. But Jesus is greater than Moses (John 1:17–18; 6:32–33; Hebrews 3:1–6), because He teaches with the authority of God's own Son and not as a mere teacher of the law (Matthew 7:29).



Curiosity

LESSON 2 EARLY CHILDHOOD

Spark curiosity, encourage exploration, and get kids thinking about the wonder of God.

Curiosity Activity: Exploring Feathers

SUPPLIES: various sizes of fake feathers, kitchen colander

Welcome! I'm so glad you are here! Can you guess what might show up in our story today by looking at these? Show kids the feathers. Let them feel the feathers, blow on them, and stick them in the upside-down colander. While kids are playing with the feathers, make a bird sound. Let's see ... we have feathers, and I think I hear birds chirping. Do you think birds will be in the story today? If so, you're right!



Belief

Guide kids into knowing God, exploring His big story, and marveling at His wonder.

Prayer of Invitation

Before entering into God's big story, lead kids in a prayer of invitation. Use the prayer here or your own words: God, thank You for giving us Your Word, the Bible. May Your Holy Spirit open our hearts and ears to hear what You have to say to us today. Help us hear and obey the truths that You have for us. In Jesus' name, Amen.

God's Big Story

Pull out the Bible. Ask: What is this called? *The Bible* Ask: Why is the Bible important? *Because it is God's word. Everything in it is true. It really happened.* **TELL THE BIBLE STORY**

Word of Wonder

WORD OF WONDER

Love the Lord your God with all your heart.

—Luke 10:27a

Encourage the kids to do the motions and say the verse with you.

- LOVE—Give yourself a hug.
- THE LORD YOUR GOD—Point up.
- WITH ALL YOUR HEART.—Put your hands over your heart.
- LUKE 10:27a—Open your hands in front of you, like opening a book.

Gather kids to discuss these questions:

- How can we show God that we love Him?
- How does loving God with all our hearts show God we hear and obey Him?

Identity

LESSON 2 EARLY CHILDHOOD

Create space for God to remind kids they are known, loved, led, and their lives can tell of God's wonder.

Hear and Obey

Leader Tip: To make the activity easier for younger kids, do the motions with them and have them mimic you. To make it harder for older kids, try to trick them by doing the opposite of what you say, such as sitting down when you say, "Stand up."

Jesus told the people they needed to hear and obey His message. Are you good at listening and obeying? Let's play a game to find out! I'm going to give you some directions, but I will only say them once, so listen closely to what I say, and then do the action.

Use the following commands (or make up your own):

Spin in a circle.	Touch your nose.
Jump up and down.	Sit down.
Touch your head.	Stand up.
Touch the ground.	Shout "Jesus loves me!"
Shout "Hooray!"	Touch your knees.
Touch your toes.	Touch the ground.
Clap your hands.	Open and close your mouth.

• Rub your tummy.

Prayer and Blessing

After the kids finish their activity, pray with them, thanking God for giving us His Word and truth to plant in our hearts. Give each kid a seed to hold while saying the prayer.

God, thank You for speaking to us in Your Word. May Your Holy Spirit plant Your truths deep in our hearts. Help us hear and obey what You teach us in Your big story. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Encourage the kids to hold their hands out in front of them, with palms up, as if their hands were open to receive something. Tell them to listen and receive the blessing as you speak it over them.

Blessing: You have God's truth planted deep in your hearts. May your roots grow down into God's love and keep you strong, and may you have the power to understand how wide, how long, how high, and how deep is His love.
