WONDER TRUTH: God Helps Us through Hard Things

SCRIPTURE: James 1

WORD OF WONDER: 1 Corinthians 13:13 (NIrV)

Ever been tempted to quit when something got too challenging? What was the source of that temptation? Why is resisting that particular temptation so hard?

Our enemy knows where we're vulnerable. I remember a time in my life when I faced discouragement at every turn, and I felt as though the season of difficult things was never going to end. I wanted to give in and give up. I wanted to quit.

James 1 might be the most famous passage that addresses facing temptations and trials. But it's also famous for reminding us we have the option to choose our mindset when facing those challenges. Take a few moments now to read James 1.

God provides a source of strength and endurance to help us get past the temptations. According to James, that source is joy.

When I've chosen joy, I've gained strength I didn't know I had and the perseverance to keep pushing through and beyond.

What are you facing in your life that feels too hard and the temptation is to give up or take an easier way out? What truths about God's love and power make it possible for you to choose joy right now?

God is ready to meet you, equip you, empower you, and fill you with all wisdom and understanding so you can have the perseverance to stand the tests and trials. He will help you through.

PERSEVERANCE

DID YOU KNOW?

FOUNDATION BUILDING BLOCKS

WHO?

James, the brother of Jesus, is barely mentioned in the Gospels. He doesn't seem to have placed any faith in Jesus until after His resurrection. According to 1 Corinthians 15:7, Christ appeared to James, who afterward became a leader in the early church.

WHAT?

James sounds quite a lot like his brother Jesus, who taught in parables and short sayings. James even uses the same phrasing as the Beatitudes: "Blessed is the person who ..." (James 1:12). His letter is often compared to wisdom literature.

WHERE?

James was based in Jerusalem, where he led Jewish Christians until his martyrdom. James writes to the scattered 12 tribes of Israel (James 1:1). His reference to the scattering, or diaspora, could mean the collective people of God in all places.

WHEN?

James was executed at the direction of the high priest in Jerusalem around the year AD 62. His letter doesn't have a firm date, but it appears to respond in some way to Paul, perhaps in the AD 40s or 50s

CONNECTING TO GOD'S BIG STORY

James reminds followers of Christ to live in a sensible way, making peace with others. He modeled the role of peacemaker when he gave a hand in fellowship with Paul and Barnabas, accepting their ministry to Gentiles, even while he ministered to Jews (Galatians 2:9).



Curiosity

LESSON 5 EARLY CHILDHOOD

Spark curiosity, encourage exploration, and get kids thinking about the wonder of God.

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Activity: How Do You Feel?

Greet the kids warmly and welcome them to church.

Welcome! How is everyone feeling today? Do you feel happy, sad, or mad? Sometimes we all feel happy and sad and mad, and it's OK to feel all of those feelings! Can you show me what your face looks like when you feel happy? Encourage kids to smile. What does your face look like when you are sad? Encourage kids to frown. What does your face look like when you are mad? Encourage kids to make a mad face.

Discuss feelings based on the ages of the kids you have present.

If you have older toddlers in your group, you might ask them for examples of times they felt each of these ways. Can you tell me about a time when you felt happy? When do you feel sad? When do you feel mad? Allow the kids to respond.

If you have younger toddlers, you might ask questions like: If your mom or dad gives you a great big hug, show me with your face whether that makes you happy, sad, or mad.

If your parent says you can't have a cookie until after dinner, show me with your face whether that makes you feel happy, sad, or mad.

If your big sister or brother won't play with you, show me with your face whether that makes you feel happy, sad, or mad.

If you have a very young group, you could just give examples and tell them which face to make.

You might feel happy when your mom or dad gives you a great big hug! Show me your happy face!

You might feel mad when your mom says you can't have a cookie until after dinner! Show me your mad face!

You might feel sad if your big sister or brother won't play with you! Show me your sad face.

God loves us and helps us no matter what we go through or how we feel.

Belief

Guide kids into knowing God more deeply, exploring His big story, and marveling at His wonder.

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Prayer of Invitation

Before entering into God's big story, lead kids in a prayer of invitation. Use the prayer here or your own words: God, You never promised our lives would always be easy, but You do promise to always be with us whenever our lives get hard. You love us, and You will always be with us! Thank You for helping us when we go through hard things. In Jesus' name, Amen.

God's Big Story

Pull out the Bible

Ask: What is this? The Bible

Ask: Why is it important? Because it is God's word. Everything in it is true. It really happened.

TELL THE BIBLE STORY

Read James 1: 2-4; 13; 17-18 and/or the summary below. If you use the summary, you can also use the letters provided in your Belief bag.

Summary:

A man named James, who was a brother of Jesus, wrote a message that encourages those following Jesus to keep going when life is hard. We have some letters from James that will help us understand that message. Let's pretend we're living in the early church days and see what James has to say to us.

² My brothers and sisters, you will face all kinds of trouble. When you do, think of it as pure joy. ³ Your faith will be tested. You know that when this happens it will produce in you the strength to continue. ⁴ And you must allow this strength to finish its work. Then you will be all you should be. You will have everything you need.

¹³ When a person is tempted, they shouldn't say, "God is tempting me." God can't be tempted by evil. And he doesn't tempt anyone.

¹⁷ Every good and perfect gift is from God. This kind of gift comes down from the Father who created the heavenly lights. These lights create shadows that move. But the Father does not change like these shadows. ¹⁸ God chose to give us new birth through the message of truth. He wanted us to be the first harvest of his new creation.

#1: Dear Friends,

As people who follow Jesus, you might face all kinds of trouble. But when you do, you should think of it as pure joy! When hard things happen, they help you to be stronger. As followers of Jesus, we might all face trouble and hard times, but these hard things help us to trust God. Love, James

#2: Dear Friends.

Sometimes we're tempted to do wrong things, which means we want to do wrong things. But we shouldn't blame God when we are tempted. God never tempts anyone. Instead, God will be with us when we want to do wrong things, and He will give us the courage to do the right thing. Love, James

#3: Dear Friends,

Blessed (or happy) are the people who keep going even when times are hard. After they have come through hard times, they will receive a crown of life. The Lord has promised it to those who love Him. Toys and things here on earth will soon go away, but people who love God will have something that will never go away—life with Him forever! When you go through trouble, you become like the winners of a race who receive crowns on their heads from God. He loves you! Love, James

#4: Dear Friends.

Do you like to receive gifts? I do! Every good and perfect gift is from God! Remember that God made the heavens and the earth. God only gives good gifts. Anything we face that is bad or wrong is not from God. God wants us to share His love with everyone else on earth. That's why we can always remember that God helps us through hard things. Love, James

So even though we may go through hard times, God still loves us. It's good to remember that God helps us through hard things.

Identity

Create space for God to remind kids they are known, loved, led, and their lives can tell of God's wonder.

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Activity: Happy & You Know It

Sing the song "If You're Happy and You Know It" with the kids. Sing it through three times, first with *happy*, and then with sad, and then with mad. Encourage the kids to clap with you and to make happy, sad, and mad faces as you sing.
