WONDER TRUTH: God Can Provide in Unexpected Ways

SCRIPTURE: 1 Kings 17

WORD OF WONDER: From Ephesians 3:20

Take a moment and read 1 Kings 17:7–24. I love to see how God is faithful to provide in unexpected ways. I love that this widow gives out of her own need, and God provides her with more than she can imagine. I love that Elijah experiences grace through the hand of another and that both are blessed as a result.

I have experienced the same miracle but not necessarily in the same way. Rather, my miracle of having my needs met has been much more through the community of faith who add to my jar. A bit of encouragement here. An anonymous financial gift here. A sprinkle of laughter and a smidge of prayer. A dollop of rides for my kids and a generous serving of text messages and calls.

GOD PROVIDES FOR ELIJAH

DID YOU KNOW?

FOUNDATION BUILDING BLOCKS

WHO?

Elijah was a prophet during the time of King Ahab. God provided for Elijah's needs through ravens and through the unnamed widow of Zarephath. The widow's son was brought back to life through Elijah's prayers.

WHAT?

Israel rebelled against God, and their newest king, Ahab, did more evil things than all the kings before him ([1 Kings 16:30](#)). God caused a famine to come to the land as a consequence of these actions and to convince Ahab that the Lord of Israel is God alone.

WHERE?

Kerith Valley, also known as the Jordan Valley, was located just east of the Jordan River. The city of Zarephath was located between Tyre and Sidon and is known today as Sarafand, Lebanon. It is possible Jesus visited there in His journeys ([Mark 7:24](#)).

WHEN?

Elijah's experience took place during the reign of King Ahab and Queen Jezebel. Ahab was the seventh king of the northern kingdom of Israel and is believed to have reigned between 874–853 BC.

CONNECTING TO GOD'S BIG STORY

Centuries later, Jesus reminded His disciples that God will care for our needs as He does the lilies of the field and the birds of the air. Jesus is our ultimate provision, giving us all we need for eternal life in God by grace through faith ([Ephesians 2:8](#)).



Curiosity

LESSON 4 **EARLY CHILDHOOD**

Spark curiosity, encourage exploration, and get kids thinking about the wonder of God.

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Play Stations

SUPPLIES: play dough, coloring utensils, toy plates and disposable silverware (optional)

Wonder Ink RESOURCES: [God Provides for Elijah Coloring Sheet](#) (1 per kid)

Greet kids warmly as they arrive and briefly explain the play stations. Invite them to play at any of the play stations.

Welcome to church! While we're getting ready to start, you can play at any of these stations to help get ready for our lesson today. Do you have any ideas of what we'll be learning about today?

Play Station: Knead the Dough

Set-up: Set out play dough. You can also set out toy plates, disposable silverware, and serving ware.

Play: Allow the kids to use the play dough to create pretend food. They can use the toy plates, silverware, and serving ware to create and serve the pretend food.

Play Station: God Provides for Elijah Coloring Sheet

Set-up: Print one copy per kid of the [Coloring Sheet](#). Set out the [Coloring Sheets](#) and coloring utensils.

Play: Let the kids color. The kids can also turn the sheet over and draw a picture of their favorite food on the back.

Guide kids into knowing God, exploring His big story, and marveling at His wonder.

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Prayer of Invitation

Before entering into God's big story, lead kids in a prayer of invitation. Use the prayer here or your own words: **Dear God, we praise You for the ways You provide for us. Help us see You in unexpected ways in God's big story today. In Jesus' name, Amen.**

God's Big Story

Pull out the Bible

Ask: What is this called? The Bible

Ask: Why is the Bible important? Because it is God's word. Everything in it is true. It really happened.

God Watches Over Elijah & Elijah Helps a Widow

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

In God's big story today, what is one way God provided for Elijah? (*water, bread from a raven, flour and oil for bread from the widow, and life to the widow's son*)

What two things did the widow need to make the bread? (*flour and oil*)

• **What did God do through Elijah when the widow's son died?** (*He brought the boy back to life.*)

• **What was unexpected about this story?** (*Ravens gave Elijah food; the widow's flour never went empty; God raised the widow's son from the dead.*)

• **Who gives you food and water? How does this show you are cared for by that person?**

• **If birds could drop any food to you, which food would you choose?**

• **How does God show He cares about you?**

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Word of Wonder

WORD OF WONDER

**God is able to do far more than we could
ever ask for or imagine.**

— Ephesians 3:20

Review the verse and encourage the kids to do the motions and say the verse with you.

Gather kids to discuss these questions:

- **What is one thing God did for Elijah?**
- **What is something good that God has done for you or provided for you?**

Help kids see the wonder of God's story and how it connects to their own story.

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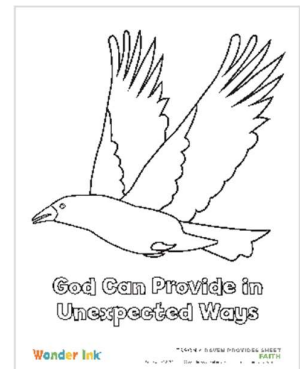
WORD OF WONDER: From Ephesians 3:20

Craft: Ravens Provide

SUPPLIES: coloring utensils, bread stickers

Wonder Ink RESOURCES: [Ravens Provide Sheet](#) (1 per kid)

Ahead of time, print one copy per kid of the Ravens Provide Sheet. Set out coloring utensils and allow the kids to color the raven on their papers. Then allow the kids to put on 2 bread stickers (near the raven). As the kids work, ask them to share ways God has provided for them. Share a story from your own life of how God has provided for you—perhaps in an unexpected way.



In God's big story, we learned that God provided for Elijah in unexpected ways, such as using ravens to provide bread to Elijah! I didn't expect birds to bring food to Elijah.

Take your picture home to remind you that God can provide in unexpected ways.

Create space for God to remind kids they are known, loved, led, and their lives can tell of God's wonder.

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Closing Game: Find the Bread

SUPPLIES: bread die cuts

Ahead of time, hide the die cut bread around the room.

Today, we learned how God can provide in unexpected ways! God provided bread for Elijah, a woman, and her son so they had food to eat. God provides for us too. Let's play a game to find some hidden bread to help us remember how God provided for Elijah, the woman, and her son. I have hidden some pretend bread around the room. We're going to try to find it. Can you find the pretend bread?

Allow kids to find the bread. You can play a couple more rounds if you have time.

Our bread was hidden in some unexpected places! Just like we learned today, God can provide in unexpected ways!

Prayer and Blessing

After the kids finish their activity, pray with them, thanking God for providing for us.

Dear God, thank You for all we have and all the ways You have provided for us in the past. Help us continue to thank You for the unexpected ways You will provide for us in the future. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Encourage the kids to hold their hands out in front of them, with palms up, as if their hands were open to receive something. Tell them to listen and receive the blessing as you speak it over them.

Blessing: May God provide for all your needs and surprise you in unexpected ways this week.
